


(Geometric) World Growth in Confirmed COVID-19 Cases: First 13 Days





Coronavirus-related hospitalization

As of April 14, 21,518 cases of coronavirus were reported in Louisiana. Of those cases, 1,977 people are currently in hospitals and 436 of them are on ventilators.



What considerations and guidance do state health departments need or want to distribute PPE and medical equipment / assign clinicians / perform work according to crisis standards of care?

- Algorithm for prioritization of resources
- National or regional coordination of efforts to reduce duplication and waste
- Leadership from professional associations (ACGME, ACOG, AAMC, AACN)
- HHS, OSHA, CDC or other guidelines for best practice

What actual decisions are state health departments and/or medical systems having to make, and what information or guidance could help them better make those decisions?

- Who needs what type of PPE? For what procedures? When?
- Patient considerations (COVID-19 +/- or unknown)
- Scheduling considerations, patient safety in hospitals, "essential worker" safety
- Support for alternative treatment pathways and end of life care

In the face of rapidly changing protocols for clinical care of those with COVID-19, how should or can state health departments and/or medical systems adapt to ensure that their decisions are always being informed by the most up to date information?

- Social Media hospitals, professional associations, local updates
- Vetting and curating of information NAM / Academic research institutions / Private sector
- Registries, research, and protocols streamlined
